# EQUESTRIAN USE

## HORSE TRAILER PARKING

Most access points have limited parking and may only accommodate one or two horse trailers. Adequate room for horse trailer parking is available at or nearby the following access points:

## TENT CAMPING

Camping is prohibited at all trail access points. Camping is only permitted at the 11 rustic camp areas along the trail. All sites are free of charge on a first-come, first-served basis. Eight sites have vault toilets and four of those also have drinking water available. Many of the camp sites accommodate one or two tents. The following areas are large enough for group/horse camping and have adequate room to tether horses nearby. The Cloverlick and Harter camping areas have multiple camp sites.

## TRAILER CAMPING

The only camping permitted on or near the GRT is tent camping at the many primitive sites along the trail. Trailer camping with horses is available at the following areas — at varying distances from the trail:

### **Watoga State Park**

#### **Laurel Run Primitive Camping Area**

This area is located near the park's south entrance, which is approximately 11 miles from the Greenbrier River Trail at Seebert. Fire ring, table, and vault toilets. Camping fee. (304) 799-4087 or 1-800-CALL WVA

### **Greenbrier State Forest**

Horse camping is available at the forest's Camping Overflow Area. Campers may use facilities in the nearby campground. Located five miles from the trail at Caldwell. Camping fee. (304) 536-1944

### **Greenbrier Mountaineer Campground**

Full service campground that permits horse camping. Near Greenbrier State Forest and five miles from the trail at Caldwell. Trailer Camping fee. (304) 536-1512

## FOR YOUR INFORMATION

The Greenbrier River Trail is closed to motorized traffic; however, you will encounter patrol/maintenance vehicles on the trail.

For health reasons, horses are not permitted within the camp sites or near eating or sleeping areas.

Tether horses to hitching rail or hitching post (if available); otherwise use a picket line between trees (do not tie horses directly to trees or picnic tables).

Avoid cross-country riding. Greenbrier River Trail property is very narrow, so please respect private property.

Straw and hay are not permitted in camp sites.

Refuse containers are not provided along trail. Plan to pack out all trash.

One gate post is in place to prevent unauthorized motor-vehicle access to the trail from the parking area near Cass. Wide loads such as wagons will need to arrange for a gate key.

Bridges and tunnels may be hazardous; therefore, we recommend you lead horses across bridges and through tunnels. A small flashlight may be useful in tunnels. Bridges and trestles are 10 feet wide and have wood decking and handrails.
